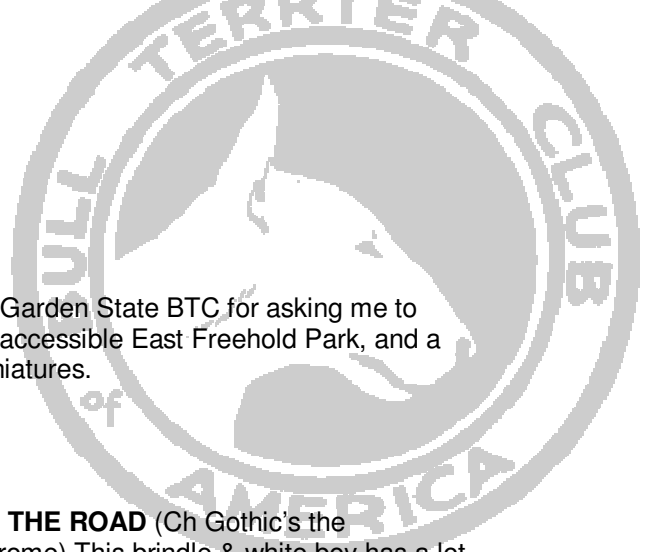


**Garden State Bull Terrier Club

Winners Dog & Best of Opposite Sex

Lovells' & Nadeaus' **MAINELY KING OF THE ROAD** (Ch Gothic's the Kingmaker ex CH Corsaire Sparkling Chrome) This brindle & white boy has a lot of maturing to do, still very puppyish, but all the framework is in the right place and he should be an impressive dog when he grows into himself. His head has a pretty profile, good bite and decent width and fill, with a far better layback of shoulder and return of upper arm than his competitor. His movement was a bit erratic, but he was cheerful and doing his best to cooperate. His back appears a bit long at this stage, but maturity may present a different picture altogether

Reserve Winners Dog

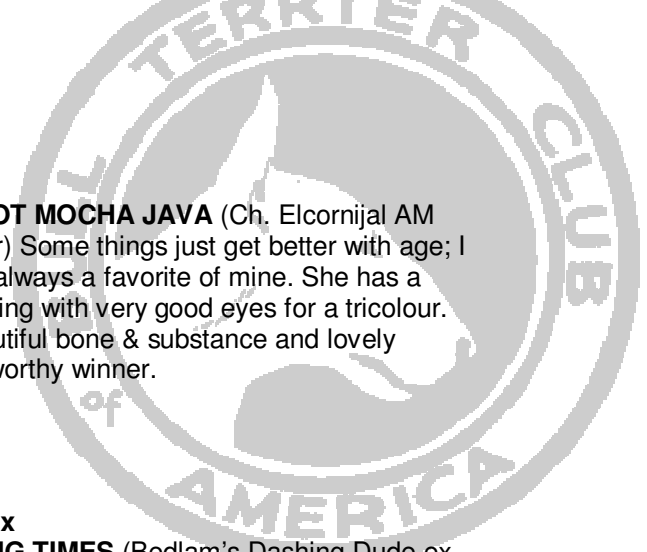
Denbow & Wilson's **LEGACY'S SMOKIN' ACES OF WINSOR** (Ch. Victoria's Grimaldi Windfall ex Ch Winsor's Hope Springs Eternal) A very together youngster, impeccably presented. He is such a baby that it's hard to assess him against more mature competition, and his front & shoulder assembly is not his fortune, but he has a lovely square little body, a decent head with good bite, and was just delighted to be showing off his considerable charm.

Winners Bitch & Best of Winners

Giamo & Bishops' **BULLFUL'S INSTANT KARMA AT MINOTAUR** (Ch Rockytop's Sundance Kid ex Merlindan Sugar N Spice) A big red substantial girl, with fabulous bone, well made front and rear with a solid topline, she caught my eye immediately. Her head is well turned and filled, mouth is just off scissors. She is not an enthusiastic show girl, but her movement is clean and correct and her virtues of make & shape cannot be ignored.

Reserve Winners Bitch

Wilson & Dussault's **LEGACY'S LUCKY ROSE OF WINSOR** (Ch. Victoria's Grimaldi Windfall ex Ch Winsor's Hope Springs Eternal) This is another adorable baby, again with a total "ShowGirl" approach to life, impeccably presented and showing her socks off. She has a beautiful filled up, turned and deep head, with a correct bite. She's square, typey and has excellent bone for her size. Despite her youth, she has everything in the right place, and as she matures she should be impressive indeed



Best of Variety

Wilson's & Dussault's **CH WINSOR'S HOT MOCHA JAVA** (Ch. Elcornijal AM Silver Star ex Betons Nightstar of Winsor) Some things just get better with age; I was delighted to see this tricolour bitch, always a favorite of mine. She has a breathtaking headpiece, long and sweeping with very good eyes for a tricolour. Her mouth is regrettably off, but her beautiful bone & substance and lovely bodylines make her a truly elegant and worthy winner.

Winners Dog and Best of Opposite Sex

McGee & Lecki's **BEDLAM'S CHANGING TIMES** (Bedlam's Dashing Dude ex Ch Bedlam's Sweet November) A moderately sized dog, adequate profile and well-arched neck, leading to clean front and good feet. Mouth is just off, ears are correctly placed, eyes could be better placed as he lacks a bit in "varminty" expression. His shoulder layback and length of upper arm could be a bit better, but elbows are tucked right in and topline is short and strong with correct gentle arch over loin. He could use a bit more strength in the rear, but he moves well all ways and was beautifully presented. He has good bone and substance, and his maturity and balance carried him to WD.

Reserve Winners Dog

Wilson & Dussault's **LEGACY'S HUGHES YOUR DADDY OF WINSOR** (Ch. Victoria's Grimaldi Windfall ex Ch Winsor's Hope Springs Eternal) Another charming puppy, littermate to the RWD & RWB in coloureds, and another happy showman. Unlike his petite sister and square little brother, this boy is built on more statuesque lines. He is really going to take some time to grow into himself, as he's at that stage where his back end and his front end don't seem to be communicating with each other. He has a lovely filled & turned head with a good bite and nicely placed eyes and ears, stunning bone and substance, and an outgoing personality. At this point in time he's a bit high in the rear, and his movement was uncoordinated, partly because of his immaturity and partly because he was paying attention to other things! I'll be very interested to see how he matures as there's a lot of promise there.

Winners Bitch & Best of Winners

Deitz's & Wendler's **SHAZAAM ST GEORGE TASTE OF HONEY** (Ch. Gwynsel It's Not Unusual ex Ch Shazam's Bit O'Honey) Lovely square girl carrying red, beautiful bone & substance, well laid back shoulder leading to strong topline and well developed rear end. She moves well, with drive and power. Her head is strong, mouth slightly off. I wish her eyes were better placed and shaped, as she gives way in expression. Ears are neat and placed right on top of her head. She is a classic brood bitch type and should produce beautifully given her correct construction. She was WB/BOW for her type and balance.



Reserve Winners Bitch

Thomas & Bishop's **BULLFUL'S MIZUNDASTOOD** (Ch. Desert KahuKo Vom Jubel ex Ch Sarafina of Bullful the Joker) Another big solid girl, with a strong head without exaggeration, she has excellent bone and substance, and a square balanced body. Her mouth is off, expression could be a bit sharper head on. She was not an enthusiastic mover, but she's cleanly made and it's hard for her to put a foot wrong. She was RWB for her balance and honesty, and should be another valuable brood bitch.

Best of Variety

Glaser, Remer & Mackay-Smith's **CH BANBURY BEDROCK BUGATTI** (Ch Caliber Play the Fool ex Ch Banbury Bedrock Barchetta) Another well balanced and typey Bull Terrier, excellent head and expression, with bone appropriate for his moderate size. He has a correct mouth, and a lovely front, with an elegant neck. He moves well and with power and is an impressive dog. I wish he had a bit less rise over the loin, which I found particularly noticeable on the move, but it's a minor fault in a very virtuous dog.
